## Result 3: Mainstreaming pastoralism in other development areas

- Policy briefs (gender as a cross-cutting theme) :
  - Nutrition: FP initiates, compiled with recommandations and suggestions Ggroup
  - Climate change (AWB and Wolfgang): based on previous one and reaction on The Economist
  - Land: Ken coordinates in EA and Alba in EU
- Practical Case:
  - Windmill-energy proiject Kenya
    - Resources are already there for the research
    - Consequences: disrupting communities, environmental assesment lacks, etc.
    - Objective: Research journalists (independent): invite them to write an article and research
    - Cordaid and EA coordinate
  - LAPSSET
    - Local colleague Cordaid working in Kenya on this
    - Example for Cordaid how pastoralist vision comes into extractives
