### **How CELEP operates**

- Informal advocacy group of European organisations & specialists partnering with pastoralist (support) organisations & specialists in Eastern Africa
- Agenda set by Annual General Meeting (AGM)
- Core Group (currently Agrecol, DADO, IIED, IUCN, PENHA, PFE, RECONCILE & VSFB) takes intermediate decisions (through email and conference calls)
- Focal Points (FPs):
  - European FP (currently vacant) coordinates CELEP activities in Europe
     + serves as secretariat for the Coalition
  - Eastern African FP (RECONCILE) coordinates CELEP activities in Eastern Africa & input to advocacy in Europe

### **CELEP's foci in promoting pastoralism**

- Recognition of pastoralism as valuable & viable livelihood system that contributes to national & regional economies, food security, employment, sustainable management of natural resources & ecosystem services
- Mobility as a crucial condition for sustainable pastoralism, also across national borders
- ➤ Pastoralists' rights to access and manage natural resources (land, vegetation, water etc) and to be heard
- Pastoralism as positive example of resilience in the face of climate change

- Organised 2<sup>nd</sup> edition of festival, launched Sept 2022 in Prague
- Managing film festival website (www.pastoralistfilmfestival.com)
- Produced animated video "Pastoralism is the future" and trailers for "Perspectives on Pastoralism" film festival
- Contributed to making two animated videos for IIED's Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) on pastoralism:
  - on pastoralism & climate change (DITSL & Agrecol, funded by Misereor)
  - on how pastoralism does not lead to overgrazing (funded by VSFB)
- Screening films from 2<sup>nd</sup> edition of film festival with PASTRES photo exhibition, Dec 2022 in Brussels



### Collaboration with other networks / projects

- Part of Global Coordination Group for International Year of Rangelands & Pastoralists (IYRP) & played strong role in campaign (including handling "online booth" <a href="www.iyrp.info">www.iyrp.info</a>) that led to approval by UNGA on 15 March 2022 for IYRP 2026

- Part of International Affairs Committee of Society of Range
   Management (for annual SRM conferences with CELEP speakers)
- Study on pastoralism & renewable energy with Kenya case study for Heinrich Böll Foundation & Bread for the World (Germany)
   & deeper research with U Leicester (CRDD & Agrecol)
- Advisory support to IIED's MOOC on pastoralism

### CELEP meetings 2021–22 and follow-up

- Annual General Meeting: Jan 2021 to discuss CELEP external evaluation and plan for 2021 (virtual, 26 participants)
- Core Group meetings (virtual): Apr 2021 & Mar 2022
   Follow-up: Survey of European member organisations about commitment to CELEP:
  - 17 positive / 2 considering involvement / 2 did not respond

    Some can contribute only in kind; membership fees of *ca* €20,000/yr could be expected plus matching grant from Misereor
- Core Group meeting (virtual): Oct 2022
   Follow-up: Discussions with Marc-Olivier Herman / EUChanger about making in-depth study & helping prepare
   3-year strategy for EU lobbying

## Seeking host/advocacy organisation for CELEP in Europe

- Discussions with VSF International (based in Brussels) about possibility of joint position for advocacy on pastoralism (CELEP) and One Health (VSFI)
- Discussions (including Misereor) with Friends of the Earth Europe (based in Brussels) about joining CELEP and their possible role in CELEP advocacy in Brussels
- Discussions with SNV (based in The Hague) about their possible role in CELEP advocacy
- Discussions with Mercy Corps (with Brussels office) about their new 10-year advocacy strategy in Horn of Africa
- No decision made yet about host/advocacy lead

### **Summary & conclusion**

- Several activities related to communications, knowledge management, webinars, film festivals and one-off advocacy events at global level
- Very few activities concerned with advocacy directly targeted at European Union institutions
- No-one dedicated to coordinating CELEP advocacy activities, particularly at European level
- Continued need for CELEP advocacy strategy development and Brussels-based advocacy coordination
